Notice of School Meeting Andover Central School

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the annual meeting of the inhabitants of Central School District No. 1 of Andover, Allegany County, qualified to vote at school meeting in said district will be held at the school house in said district on Tuesday, July 11, 1967 at 8:00 o'clock p. m., for the transaction of such business as is authorized by the Education Law.
And notice is also given that a copy of the statement of the amount of money which will be required for the ensuing year for school purposes exclusive of public monies, may be obtained by any taxpayer in the said district during the seven days immediately preceding the annual meeting except Saturday, Sunday or holiday at each of the following maintained during the hours designated:
Andover Central School, 9 - 12 a. m., and 1 - 4 p. m.
And notice is also given that petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the board of education must be filed with the clerk of the district not later than June 27, 1967.
The following vacancies are to be filled on the Board of Education:
Term: Five years (Name of last incumbent: Walter Gath).
Each vacancy requires a separate petition to nominate a candidate to each separate office. Each petition must be directed to the clerk of the district, must be signed by at least twenty-five qualified voters of the district, must state the name and residence of the candidate and must describe the specific vacancy for which the candidate is nominated including at least the length of the term of office and the name of the last incumbent.
Also vote on the following Resolutions:
RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Andover, Andover, Westville, Independence, and Ward, Allegany County; and Greenwood Steuben County, is hereby authorized and directed to purchase one school bus and expend therefor a gross sum not exceeding \$8,950.00, and that there shall be applied to the purchase any trade-in allowance to be received for a bus now owned by the school district, and that the afore said total sum of \$8,950.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by tax on the taxable property of the school district to be collected in annual installments; and further resolved that the Board of Education is authorized to issue obligations of the district therefor in accordance with the Education Law and Local Finance Law.

In Edinburgh, Scotland the group presented a concert at the Princess Gardens and in Kerkrade, Holland, a concert was presented at the Festival Concert Hall.

This week the group made a steamer trip down the Rhine, gave a concert at the Rosengarten in Mannheim, Germany, and a concert in the King's Hall of the Hiedelberg Castle. Two days were spent in Switzerland.

The schedule included a drive through Lichtenstein and arrival at Innsbruck, Austria where they spent the Fourth of July week-end and at Venice, Italy the group visited Mittenwald, the town of the violin makers, and presented a concert at the Royal Garden Pavilion at Innsbruck, Monday and Tuesday were spent in Venice with a concert the evening of the Fourth on St. Mark's Square.

The entire week will be spent in Italy and then the band and orchestra members will journey to gether to Monte Carlo. There will be almost a week in France with Bastille Day celebrations one of the highlights. Two recording sessions will be held.

The concert in London will be given at Battersea Park, July 18 and will be followed by "High Tea". There will be two BBC recording sessions in London.

The young musicians will arrive in Washington, D. C., July 19, for a final morning concert before disbanding.
