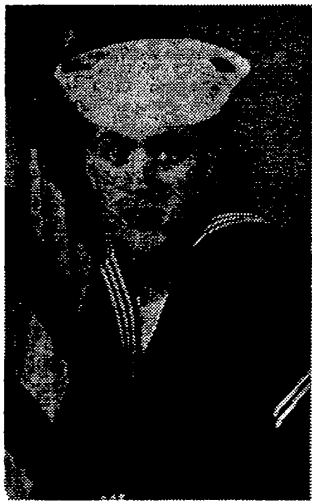

Fireman Apprentice Jack R. York Andover Sailor Home On Leave

Fireman Apprentice Jack R. York, son of Mr. and Mrs. Douglas York of RD 2, Andover and '65 Grad of Greenwood GHS, recently completed Navy Recruit Training and is currently home enjoying two weeks leave with his family and friends.

Fireman York enlisted in the Navy in Horning during April '67. His next duty station is the USS Epping Forest (Mine Warfare Countermeasures Ship 7). Epping Forest is a landing ship dock especially converted for mine warfare duties. Homeported in Long Beach, Calif., she is currently deployed to South Viet Nam. York will fly to Japan to be assigned further transportation to his ship.

Aboard Epping Forest Fireman York is slated for on the job training as a Boilerman. He will learn to make boiler repairs including brickwork, casings, uptakes and fitting, to operate motor-driven tube cleaners and to plug, cut out and replace broken tubes, to set safety valves, replace joints in steam and water lines, rivet and caulk seams and renew furnace brickwork, to operate manifolds and booster pumps, to take charge of refueling operations in any section of the ship, principals of combustion, viscosity, flashpoint and fire point of fuels and lubricants, to light and extinguish boilers, to take charge of the fire room, to read and work from blueprints, the effects of impure waters in boilers and the use of impurities neutralizing compounds, the principals governing condensers, evaporators and tube coolers.

The propelling agent for our large Naval Ships, is steam, generated by either nuclear fires or oil fires. The Navy leans heavily upon its Boilermen to keep the fleet moving. Some related civilian occupations are Marine Fireman, Boiler Shop Repairman, Boiler Inspector, Stationary Engineer, Marine Engineer and Boilermaker.

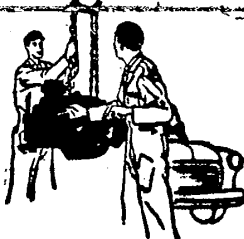
