At this annual organizational meeting Dr. Common nominated Carl Burdick for President, seconded by Alan Tuttle, carried by 5 votes of yes.

A motion to nominate Dr. Common for Vice-President was made by Alan Tuttle, seconded by Connor Stephens. 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made to nominate Reid Mattison as Treasurer by Alan Tuttle, seconded by Mrs. Mary K. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

While on unfinished business — here is a news item that we noticed as a special release to the "Suburban Press": "DOG LEASH LAW ADOPTED BY BRIGHTON" and goes on to say: "The Town of Brighton has joined the lengthening list of area communities which have enacted so-called 'leash laws' for dog control."

The new ordinance will go into effect August 1 and rules that dogs must be on leash when off an owner's property except when being used in hunting.

Dogs roaming at large in town are to be seized by a dog warden, and must be reclaimed by the owner within five days. A \$2 charge will be made for the expense of the seizure.

Action of the town board followed a hearing at Brighton High School auditorium. The hearing drew more than 550 persons, the majority of them backing the proposed ordinance.

Approximately 2,000 in the Town of Brighton will be affected by the new ordinance. Other communities in Monroe County which have enacted dog leash laws are East Rochester, Henrietta, Leontine, Greece and Brockport.

Voter Registration In Andover

ALL Allegany County Voters must register IN PERSON prior to the General Election to be held November 7, 1967. This registration will be permanent and you will never have to register again — Unless — you move or you fail to vote for two consecutive years. In either case your registration will be cancelled and you again have to register IN PERSON.

The Travelling Branch office of the Central Board of Registration will be in Andover at the TOWN HALL on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 27th, 28th and 29th. The hours for registration will be from 2:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M. on Thursday and Friday, and from 8:00 A. M. to 3:00 P. M. on Saturday.

Although this visit is primarily for the convenience of the voters of the Town of Andover, any qualified voter in Allegany County may register at such time. The same is true of any other branch office wherever it may be located in Allegany County. Andover voters are invited to register at our main office in the Court House in Belmont any weekday from 9:00 A. M. to 4:00 P. M. We also have a branch office visit at the Wellsville Municipal building about every other week-end. Any voter may register there when such branch office is in operation.

EVERY Allegany County Voter must register IN PERSON this year, regardless of their previous registration status. This registration is permanent and a voter will not have to register again — unless he moves, changes his or her name, or fails to vote for two consecutive years.

If we are able to register at least 50% of the voters of the County (about 10,600) before Sept. 5th, we will be able to reduce the LOCAL REGISTRATION days in October from 8 to 4 days, thus saving the towns of the County approximately \$12,000 (collectively). It will also give

administrative work at this office and cut down on errors created by last minute hurry. This in turn will assure the voter that he will be able to vote with a minimum of fuss on November 7th.
