## Andover Little League Loses Final Tournament Game By One Run

Saturday, July 29th in the first of two semi-final games a classy Whitesville team drubbed Scio by a score of 19 to 2. K. McAllister pitched a fine game for Whitesville as he gave up only 3 hits, all singles, 3 walks and struck out 8 Scio batters. In the sixth inning he retired the side via the strike out route.

Scio's B. Morris pitched a strong game walking 3, hitting 1 batter, striking out 9 as he gave up 2 hits with his teammates having 5 errors.

Whitesville's pitcher McAllister and catcher Rich Ordway each hit a double and 2 singles.

Saturday's second game pitted Andover against Friendship which turned out to be a 7 inning thriller with Andover winning by a score of 16 to 16.

Meacham, Baker and MacMichael pitched for Andover, giving up 12 walks, 10 hits, hitting 1 batter and striking out 8. The only extra base hits for Friendship were two home runs hit by W. Poore and J. Zackery. Friendship's pitcher W. Poore gave up 7 walks, 15 hits while striking out 11 Andover batters.

For Andover the hitters were B. Jackson, D. Sisson and F. Baker each with 3 hits. T. MacMichael had 2 with P. Mulconery, M. Dibble, S. Dunham and D. Burrows having 1 hit apiece.

The final game of the tournament was played Sunday with Whitesville pitted against Andover.

Andover held a 4 to 1 lead at the end of 4 innings then Whitesville scored 5 runs in the 5th inning on a walk, 3 hits and an error. Andover fought back in the sixth inning scoring 1 run, having the tying run at second with 2 outs, but the batter watched a third strike go by for the third out.

Final score of this game was Whitesville 6, Andover 5. Andover pitchers Meacham, Baker and MacMichael gave up 3 walks, 6 hits and struck out 6. Hitters for Andover were B. Jackson, 2 hits; D. Sisson, F. Baker, M. Poole and J. Grossman each with 1 hit.

Whitesville's pitcher R. Chase gave up 5 walks, 6 hits, hit one batter and struck out 8. Hitters for Whitesville were Rich Ordway and R. Chase, each with 1 hit. K. McAllister and J. Seger had 1 hit apiece.

After the game trophies were presented to each player and manager on the Whitesville squad.
