Then they dumped store orders out of a large leather pouch and used the pouch to carry the loot \$3,800 in \$5, \$10, and \$20 bills, \$1,000 in \$1 bills, and a few dollars in quarters. Several checks were left.

Dr. Leland Miles, Dean of the College of Arts and Science at University of Bridgeport in Connecticut, took office as the 10th

New York University, through its School of Continuing Education and Extension Services, will offer five courses this fall and winter which will be of considerable interest to civil defense officials, as well as to industry executives with civil defense responsibilities. These courses are part of NYU's Disaster Management Program, intended to train personnel at both managing and operating levels in the skills and techniques required to minimize the effects of disasters. Each course will last for 32 hours and be conducted over a five-day period.

State Comptroller Arthur Levitt has announced the distribution of \$71,610,000 for the month of August 1967 to the 65 Public Welfare Districts in the State. These monies represent approximately 80% of the Federal and State share of the anticipated welfare expenditures by the localities. The Federal share of these advances amounts to \$38,474,000.00. Allegany County receives \$93,040 of the amount.
