Welfare Cost To Rise

New York State's one million welfare recipients will receive increases in their allowances this year, to meet rising living costs that will total approximately \$15 million annually, George K. Wyman, State Commissioner of Social Services, has announced.
Commissioner Wyman said that the new allowance schedule will be released by the department at the end of the month and will be come effective no later than Jarvary 1, 1968.
For the first time New York State's welfare allowances will be based on flat grants, except for allowances for rent and fuction which vary widely in the State.

At present welfare grants are based on five age groups. This will be reduced to four groups which will be less subject to change in allowances as children grow older and which will substantially reduce paperwork for local staffs.


The present monthly allowance

The present monthly allowance (exclusive of rent) for a family of four in New York City, consisting of parents and two children, is \$193. The new allowance will be \$197.05. Allowances vary slightly in other parts of the State due to differences in utility rates.

Many drivers have tempted fate on occasion in making a left turn across a busy high-way in the face of oncoming fast-moving traffic. Unfortunately, the temptation is often great because by not "taking a chance" the driver must prepare for a long wait until the road is clear.

The law holds the dilver responsible if, when making a left turn, he causes an accident. A person making a left turn must yield right of way to all oncoming traffic, says the law.
