A uniform farm price of \$4.99 per hundredweight (46.5 quarts) will be paid to dairy farmers for July milk deliveries to pool handlers in the New York-New Jersey milkshed, it has been announced The Junc price was \$4.42; \$4.77 was paid in July, 1966.
