## Greenwood Central School News

At the regular meeting of the Greenwood Board of Education held this week at the school, the Board of Education inspected the building addition and remodeling and plans were made for necessary changes in our schedules for the opening of school on September 6. Teachers will be at the school on September 5 for meetings and working in their various departments. The students will be coming in for a full day on Wednesday, September 6.

All regular bus routes will operate at approximately the same time and on the same routes that they operated on last year.

Financing of the building program was discussed and the necessary resolution as furnished by Morris Barash, school attorney, was passed and will be advertised this week.

Principal Hoagland reported on the filling of vacancies and the Board authorized the hiring of Linda Bassett of R.D. No. 1, Canisteo as first grade teacher, Hugo Church of Andover as English teacher for grades 9 - 12 and Howard Kilbury of Stephen Mills for instrumental and vocal music. These three teachers have been issued appointment notices and have tentatively agreed to come in September. Mr. Hoagland reported that as yet he has been unable to secure an applicant for grade four but that several have indicated their willingness to help out as substitutes until a permanent teacher can be found.

Due to the fact that the kitchen will not be completed for school opening, arrangements have been worked out between the school officials and the Greenwood Methodist Church for using the church dining hall for the month of September. Students will be bussed from the school to the church dining hall at their regular eating time.

The Board accepted the resignation of Michael Sky and authorized Mr. Hoagland to hire a replacement. A full time bus driver and assistant mechanic in bus garage, is available and would include driving a regular bus route, transporting students to Hornell Vocational School, taking students home on the second run and assisting in the garage.

A discussion of estimated fall enrollment was held and it would appear that fall enrollment would be up about 10 from last year.

All bills were authorized to be paid and the meeting was adjourned.

Other school business of general interest to the community:

Mr. Bangs, Guidance Director, has recommended that anyone new to the District might wish to register at the school office before the opening day of school. Students in grades 9 - 12 that anticipate any schedule changes are urged to meet with Mr. Bangs in the Guidance Office the week of August 28.

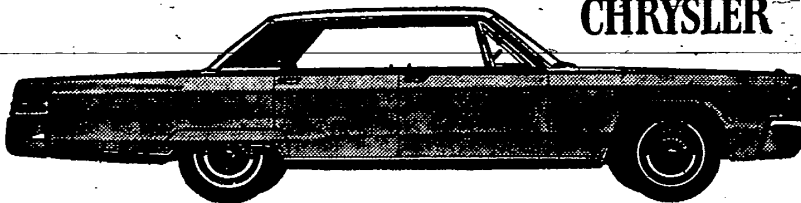

The school census is expected to be completed during the next two weeks, any new families or parents with new children should have birth certificate available.

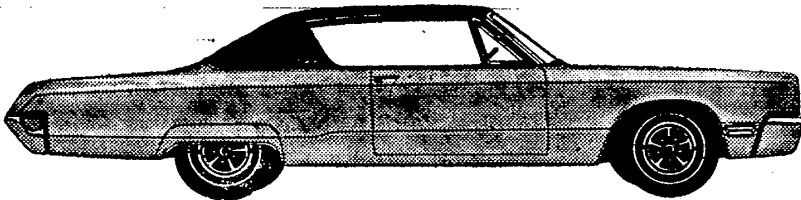

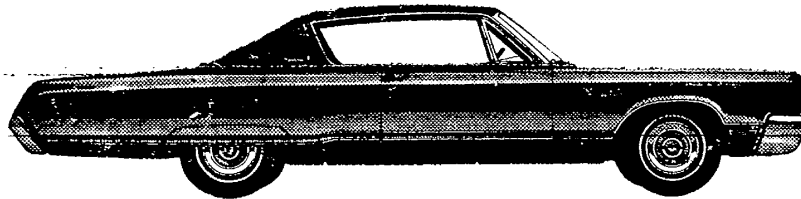
