#### John P. Lamenzo To Be Speaker At Dedication Of Civil Defense Dist. Office

The Western District Office of the State Civil Defense Commis-sion will be dedicated Saturday August 26th at 10:30 A. M., at its permanent site at Batavia. The Honorable John P. Lomenzo, Sec-retary of State, will be the key-

Honorable John P. Lomenzo, Secretary of State, will be the keynote speaker.

The first of the Commission's six districts to become operational at its permanent location, the Western District Office will serve a 10-county area comprised of the counties of Allegany, Cattaraugus. Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming, as well as the civil defense jurisdictions in the five cities of Jamestown, Niagara Ells, North Tonawarda, Olean and Salamanca.

"The 10 counties," said Lt. Gen. M. J. Asensio, State Civil Defense Director, "will report to the Western District Office which will report to the Commission's Headquarters in Albany, ensuring an orderly flow of communication to and from 'ne State Emergency Orerating Center/Alternate Seat of Government, an important consideration during times of statewide or nationwide emergency."

The new underground facility is protected from radioactive fall cut by 21 inches of earth and 12 inches of reinforced concrete. The 8700-Square-Foot installation is designed to remain fully operational during either a natural or nuclear disaster. It has an independent water supply system and a self-contained electric power or nerating unit. generating unit.
