M. to 5:00 P. M. and 6:00 P. M. to 8:00 P. M. The office will be closed from 5:00 P. M. to 6:00 P. M. to give employees working the extra evening hours a dinner break. Usual hours from 9:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. continue for Monday through Thursday.
