

New Bus Service Print To Fit To N. Y. City For **Andover Residents**

Effective Sunday, September 3, Short Line (Hudson Transit Lines Inc.) Bus Company will provide a new service operating between Jamestown, N. Y., and New York City over Route 17 serving intermediate points to New York City. "Inauguration of this service answers a long-felt need" Samuel B. Jamieson, vice president of the bus line explained. "Until now residents of the Jamestown-Corning area along Route 17 had neconvenient or direct public transportation to or from New Yo.1 rtation to or from New Yo.

The new service is the result of extensive hearings held in Jamestown, New York before the Interstate Commerce Commission:
