. (c)—No person or persons shall in any manner offer for sale or discharge any fire works rockets, gun powder or other exprosives within the Village of Andover, except that this ordinance may be suspended by the Mayofor certain special occasions.
Any person or persons violating this ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five Dollars (\$500), for more than Fifty Dollars (\$5000), for each and every violation thereof Sec. 7. Sidewalks.

The owner or occupant of any building or lot in front of which a sidewalk has been constructed shall keep such sidewalk clean and free from filth and also remove or free from filth and also remove or cause to be removed therefrom all snow and ice within 12 hours from the time the same has fallen, and that which may have fallen during the night shall be removed befor noon the following day, and upon neglect to do so the Trustees or Street Commissioner may without notice, cause the same to be removed and the expense thereof be determined and billed by the Village Board, and if not paid, be levied and collected out of the said property—the—same as any corporation tax.


