CHECK THOSE CANCELED CHECKS

For several months, Tom's checking account has been coming up a little short. Not much, but enough to start Tom looking

back through his canceled , checks to see where he had made the error. Tom made a startling discov-

ery: someone had been writing checks in small amounts over his forged signature. He called the bank immediately.

Your bank has been letting forged checks go through. I want my account reim-bursed", Tom demanded.

The bank checked into the situation and found that there were at least 10 checks forged over a period of six monthsall from Tom's account.

"Sorry, but we can't do anything about reimburning your account", the bank said. "You let those had checks pass without telling us It is up to you to find the forgery. Some of these are six months old. So far as our personnel is concerned these forgeries were your actual signature at the time. You didn't tell us otherwise."

"I'll sue", Tom said. Does Tom have a chance of recov-

In this case, probably not Tom had been negligent in not making a full recheck of his bank statement every month. When the money started disappearing from his account, he should have notified the bank immediately. Had he identified the forgeries at the start, he might have recovered the loss. But at this stage of the game — with 10 forgeries in his files — he is probably out of luck and about \$50.

The bank has the duty to stop obvious forgeries or questionable checks, but the account holder-in this case Tom — must finally discover the forgery by checking the canceled checks and balancing his personal books.

If you have a checking account, he certain you look at each check -- the amount, to whom it was paid and the signature - to make certain it tallies with your records.


