Benefit Auction For County SPCA

A new merchandise auction for the benefit of the Allegany County SPCA will be held at 8:30 p. m. Friday (Oct. 13) at the Nancy Howe Auditorium in Wellsville. John Larsen of Alfred, who is in charge of the auction, points out that all the merchandise to be auctioned off is new and has been donated by merchants from throughout Allegany County. Interspersed between the auctioning will be entertainment featuring songs by Larsen and his wife, Barbara, and other musical selections by Larsen's orchestra which includes Barrett Potter of Alfred, Bill Yerrick of Wellsville, Dick Day of Angelica, and John Taggart of Wellsville. Besides the entertainment and the auctioning, refreshments will be served. The auction will benefit the Allegany County SPCA Deficit Fund. At the present time, the SPCA has a debt of \$1,200 for the last fiscal year and the hope is that it can be paid off this month which starts the new fiscal year. "Many people do not know that the Allegany County SPCA is self-supporting", Larsen noted. "There are no county groups to supply money to the SPCA and therefore any indebtedness must be met by its own members."

Larsen suggests that the new merchandise will provide those attending the auction an opportunity "to do their Christmas shopping early" and at the same time "help a worthy cause."

Hunter Safety Courses To Be Held At Alfred

Two hunter safety instruction courses will be held in Alfred this month under the direction of area residents certified by the New York State Conservation Department. The first course is slated for 7 p. m. on Friday, Oct. 13, while the same course will be offered again at the same time on Saturday, Oct. 21. Richard Guerin of Alfred Station and Anthony D'Antonio of Alma, National Rifle Association (NRA) instructors, will teach the course in the temporary classrooms at the rear of the Industrial Building at Alfred State Tech. Guerin said the course is for all persons 14 years of age and older who have never before obtained a hunting license. He points out that successful completion of the safety program is required before a hunting license is issued for the first time. Those planning to take the instruction have been requested to furnish their own .22 caliber rifle since part of the program will involve firing at the college's rifle range. There is no charge for the course and ammunition will be furnished.

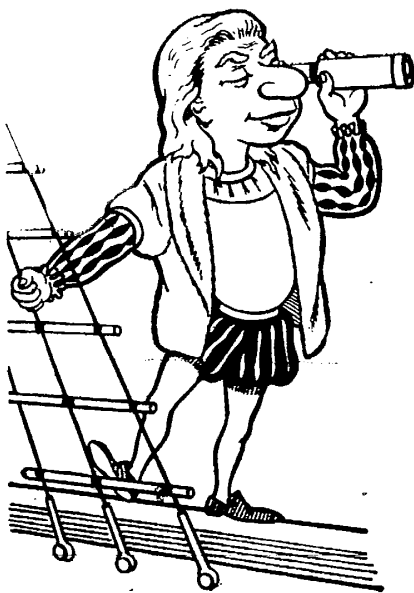
