## Collector's Notice For The Collection of School Taxes

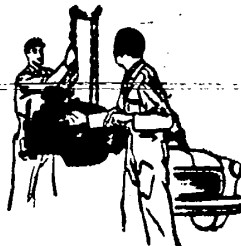
