Claire Coleman Backus, 72, former editor and publisher of the "Andover News" and charter member of the Allegany County Draft Board, was pronounced dead on arrival Thursday night in a St Petersburg, Fla., hospital. He was stricken in Pinellas Park. Fla., where he had been staying for the past several days

Mr. Backus entered into part nership in 1916 with his father, J. Harvey Backus, operating the Andover weekly newspaper which has been in the family since 1899. The younger Mr. Backus purchased the business in December 1934, serving as editor and publisher until his retirement in 1961. He was list-ed in the 1959-60 edition of "Who's Who in Allegany Coun-

ty."
The newspaper was sold in 1961 to his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Raiph A. (Jeanne) Allen of Andover. who currently operate the busi-

A native of Little Genesee. Mr. Backus was born Dec. 23. 1894, son of I Harvey and Fannie V Comman Backus. He was graduated from Andover High School and attended Alfred University.

A veteran of World War I. he served with the U.S. Marine Corps from 1918 to 1919, when He was a past commander of Lynch-Burgett Post No. 397. American Legion. in which had held membership for 49


years, and a member of Allegany County Voiture No. 1006.
