Seaman Dean Holt USN Serving Aboard The USS Harnett County

Seaman Dean Holt, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Wallie Holt of Church Hill Rd., is currently serv-ing aboard the USS HARNETT Church Hill Man, 18 Country, a landing ship tank, in the Co Chien River, in the Mekong Delta of South Viet Nam. The ship serves as a tender, or base or mother ship for River Patrol Boats, called (PBR's are 31 ft. fiberglass water-jet propelled patrol craft with heavy armament) and it provides a Helocoptor landing pad for armed Navy

Snowmobile racing, the newest winter sport, will begin at the 750 acre Rainbow Lake Recreation Area on Sunday, January 14, and every Sunday thereafter. The summertime camping and picnic area north of Ellicottville and just off Route 219 will feature unique racing across the frozen surface of the area's 65 acre lake. In announcing the weekly Sunday

In announcing the weekly Sun-day races, Owner-Manager Bob Westfall said the races over the lake course "should be fun and lake course "should be fun and produce some spectacular spins". On nonrace days, snowmobile owners are invited to bring their machines to Rainbow Lake to practice the course and ride for fun over the miles of trails through the woods, hills, and valley, or over the ice.

A snack bar and warming shelter will be available for patrons and snectators.

Because of its high elevation, Rainbow Lake has an abundance of snow. It comes here sooner and stays longer, Mr. Westfall said. "We also expect to have snowmobile rentals in the near future for those who do not own their own machines, but would like the fun and the thrill of the snort."

Race courses are operated each Sunday at the 440-Recreation Ranch in Leon, the Holland Raceway, at Centerville, and the Cattaraugus County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs at the fairgrounds in Little Valley.
