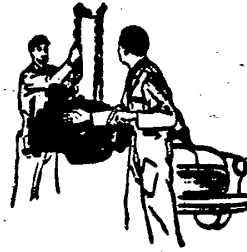
Belfast Grange will host a regional conference called by State Grange Master Robert Drake of Jasper Feb. 29.
