Sign Your Tax Return

Federal income tax returns have to be signed to be complete. When you are sure that youn 1967 tax return is complete, and you are entitled to a retund, mail it in the envelope provided in the tax package you have received, to the North Atlantic Service Center, 310 Lowell Street, Andover, Mass., 1812

poisiz.

A pre-addressed label showing the taxpayer's name, address and Social Security number is included with your tax package. Use of this label further expedites processing of your refund return. Before you attach it to your tax form, check to see that all information is correct. If not, make the necessary corrections.

John E. Foley, District Director of Internal Revenue at Buffalo, stated that last year thousands of taxpayers forgot to sign their re-

As a result their refunds

were delayed.
On joint returns, both husband and wife must sign. Each shares legal responsibility for the return and each must sign. However, if the husband is a serviceman in the Viet Nam combat zone, the wife may sign her name and in the space provided for her husband's signature, note that he is in the military forces in Viet Nam.

To evoid processing delays, take

To avoid processing delays, take another look at your return before mailing it in. This kind of double check will often avoid mailing a return that is not signed, has a missing or incorrect social security number, has no withholding form attached or has a mistake in arithmetic.

When errors occur, it is usually necessary to contact taxpayers for correct information.


