Dianne Vars Concert Soloist

The 65-piece Mansfield, Pa. College-community orchestra will present a concert Thursday, February 15, at 8 p. m., in the Elmira Free Academy, Elmira, N. Y. The orchestra in its 19th season, is comprised of music students at Mansfield State College, members of the state college faculty and musicians from the surrounding communities.

The program will include the Overture to "Candide" by Leonard Bernstein; the Piano Concerto No. 2 by Rachmaninoff featuring piano soloist Dianne Vars, a junior liberal arts music major from Andover, N. Y. Miss Vars is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth F. Vars of North Main St. Andover. Miss Vars has studied piano since she was 8-years old. She has been a choral accompanist since high school and is accompanist for the College Concert Choir. She is an accomplished cornettist and plays this instrument in the Wind Ensemble, Orchestra and Chamber Ensemble. Miss Vars is a recipient of the Theodore Presser Scholarship and is a member of Kappa Delta Pi and Music Education Club. She studies piano with Professor Wayne Rusk.

Miss Vars who studies oboe with Professor Richard Kemper, is oboist with the MSC Wind Ensemble, the Woodwind Quintet, the Corning Philharmonic and the Elmira Symphony. Besides playing oboe, Miss Vars is an accomplished violinist and plays this instrument in the College Orchestra and String Ensemble. She is a High School Solo Competition winner on oboe and is a member of Kappa Delta Pi and the Music Education Club.

Miss Patricia Barker, will be soloist in the Strauss Oboe Con-

certo. She is a senior Music Education major and the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald L. Barker of Williamsburg, Pa.

Edwin E. Zdzinski, associate professor with the state college music department is director. Michael Schwalm, son of Mr. and Mrs. Glendon H. Schwalm of Old Mill Drive, Camp Hill, a senior Music Education major, will be guest student conductor directing selections from the Peer Gynt Suite by Grieg.

The program, in addition to being presented at Elmira Free Academy, also will be given at two assembly programs for the Junior and Senior High Schools in Troy on February 16 and Sunday, February 18, at 8 p. m., the orchestra will give its concert at the state college.
