Guantanamo Bay is the United States' oldest overseas naval base, acquired through a lease agreement with Cuba in 1903. The base includes a harbor, a ship repair facilities, and two airfields. Guantanamo's wartime role is to support combatant naval forces operating in the Atlantic.

From this base, the southern approaches to the United States can be controlled. Its peacetime role is to support fleet operational training. Guantanamo's aerial gunnery range, which is available to the Atlantic Fleet, is the only one unhampered by commercial air traffic.

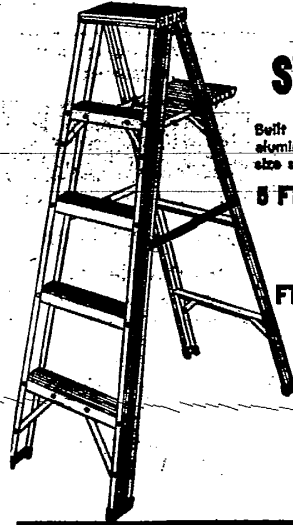

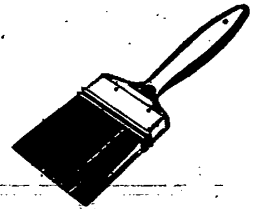

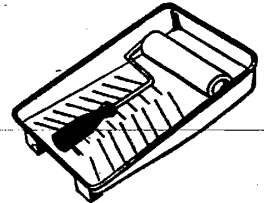
