"Lamplighters" To Present Concert At Presbyterian Church

The "Lamplighters," outstanding Waynesburg College choral ensemble from Waynesburg, Pennsylvania, will appear Monday, March 4, 1968 in a concert at 8:00 p. m. at the Andover Presbyterian Church in Andover.

Miss Gail Bronson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glen Bronson, of Andover, a freshman at Waynesburg College, is one of the soprano's in the "Lamplighters."

Organized in 1961, the famous chorus has appeared in concert halls and churches throughout eastern United States and Canada, including several military bases. Thousands have been thrilled and enriched by its singing.

Critics have hailed the Lamplighters for their brilliant tonal quality, excellent diction, and rich interpretation of both classical and contemporary compositions.

During its six year existence, the choir has had the opportunity of singing in many unusual and interesting places. Among these were on a ferryboat in New York harbor, on the telephone to the White House, at the Unisphere at the New York World's Fair in a Quaker school, in a helicopter at Ft. Eustis, Va., and on a Landing Craft Utility boat in the middle of the James River in Virginia.

The 30-voice choir was founded by Mr. James D. Randolph, assistant professor of music. A 1956 graduate of Waynesburg College, he continues his studies at West Virginia University where he received both bachelor and master of music degrees.

Concerts in Pennsylvania, New York and Connecticut are being given this year.

Dr. Ray W. Wingate

Dr. Ray W. Wingate, who was appointed to the Alfred University faculty in 1912 and served for the past 30 years as Alfred University carillonneur, died early Tuesday, February 14, 1968 at the Bethesda Hospital in Hornell after an illness of several weeks. He was 81 years old.

Dr. Wingate was the University's first and only carillonneur having been appointed to the post by the late President Dr. J. Nelson Norwood, in 1937 when the original 35 bell instrument was erected in Alfred. At that time he had already served the University for 25 years as Professor of Music, teaching organ, voice, music appreciation, harmony, theory of music and conducting chorus and glee clubs. He directed the first glee club to broadcast over Radio Station WEAJ in New York in 1923.

Funeral services were held Friday at the Alfred Seventh Day Baptist Church.
