After The 1st It's 4 Instead Of 2

State Tax Commissioner Joseph H. Murphy today reminded vendors who do business in New York State that beginning March 1, a number of new local sales and use taxes will go into effect, and that two local sales taxes will be increased.

The Sales Tax Bureau of the State Tax Department will collect and administer the new local taxes, along with the statewide 2% sales tax. As it does with existing local sales taxes the Sales Tax Bureau will return the local share of revenue to the localities after deducting administrative charges.

In each local sales tax area, the new or increased local tax rate is to be added to the 2% State sales tax, and the combined rate is the amount to be collected from the customer and reported by the vendor. The local sales tax is applied to substantially the same items presently subject to the 2% State tax.

New local sales taxes will become effective March 1, 1968, in 19 counties and three cities. Two counties have increased their existing local sales taxes, and two cities have imposed a local utilities tax.

Counties and the combined rate of State and local sales taxes to be collected beginning March 1, 1968 are:

- Albany, 4%; Allegany, 4%; Cattaraugus, 5%; Clinton, 5%; Cortland, 5%; Essex, 5%; Livingston, 5%; Madison, 4%; Montgomery, 5%; Orleans, 4%; Otsego, 4%; St. Lawrence, 5%; Schuyler, 5%; Steuben, 4%; Sullivan, 4%; Warren, 5%; Wayne, 4%; and Yates, 5%.

Additional copies of tax bracket schedules and listing of communities within specific counties will be available on request from any State Tax Department District Office, or from the Sales Tax Bureau, Building 8, State Campus, Albany New York 12226.

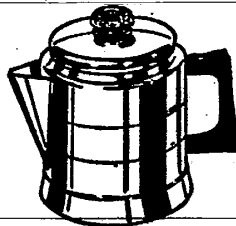
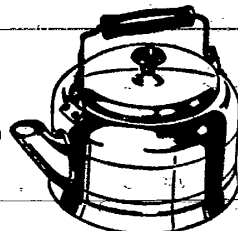
