Wesley Parish, Allegany County Red Cross Blood Program Chairman has announced that several changes take been made re-

ently concerning donor eligibility.
They are as follows:
1. A donor may give blood up
o his 61st birthday, rather than his 60th.

2. The New York State law

now permits a donor to give 5 times in a 12 month period. Eight weeks must elapse between dona-

\$. Women are ineligible as don-

Women are ineligible as donors during pregnancy and for 6 months after delivery.

4. A person having had infectious jaundice, hepititis, or maleria cannot be accepted for donations.

5. If a donor has taken antimalerial drugs he is deferred for a period of two years from the time of the last medication.
