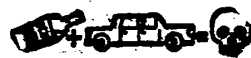
Junior News

If one looks back into history World War II was caused by the Allied nations' inaction when Ethiopia, the Rhineland, Austria, Czechoslovakia, and Poland were being taken by Hitler's troops. Let that be the answer to any question left in your mind. We must stop them, now!

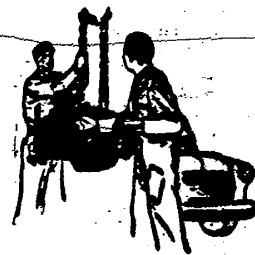
