Last week I expressed, by opinion of our role in Vietnam. But that was only my opinion. Other people have different views — on many different subjects. One of our basic American rights is the freedom of speech. However, even if we have these rights, they can be taken too far.

For example, we have the right to assemble peaceably. But this does not give us the right to riot, loot, and destroy in the name of our cause. But, on the other hand, we should not consider outspokenness on a person's part as any other thing but what it is — that person's voiced opinion. Legal dissent becomes illegal treason when one burns his draft card or flees the country to avoid the draft.

We should not and cannot condemn one for dissent, but we also cannot tolerate treason.
