Southern Tier Girl Scout Council Purchases Land

The Southern Tier Girl Scout Council announces the purchase of the Botteinger Farm on Brainard Road of County Route 17, in the Town of Belfast for camping activities of Girl Scouts in Allegany County.

This 325-acre site has a small farm home and barn, a large tree plantation, a stream, woods and several springs which can be developed for Day activities and cookouts for several troops at one time and for Troop Camping.

Walter Gillis, Jr., of Wellsville is the chairman of the Camp Site Development Committee which is studying the site and planning for the first phase of development, which will include water supply, latrines, fireplaces, shelter and parking areas.

Mrs. Grant Covill, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Nevins of Wellsville, Mrs. Ernest Jandrew of Allentown, and Eldon Coon of Belmont have been named to serve with Mr. Gillis on this committee. Representatives from other areas of Allegany County are being sought to also serve.

The purchase of the Camp Site was made possible from funds earned through the Council-wide Cookie Sale and other Council funds designated for the purchase of a Camp Site.

This Camp Site will bring to 4 the camps Southern Tier Girl Scout Council now owns. Misty Hollow, 270 acres, used for Troop Camping and summer Resident Camping for the entire Council; and 2 small Day and Troop Camping Sites - Camp Gremer near Canisteo and Camp White Oaks near Corning.

The location of the new Camp site is ideal for serving Allegany County. It is near good County and State highways and about in the middle of the County. The initial selection of this site was made by a Committee of representatives of Allegany County, after several possibilities were investigated. Mr. Gillis served as Chairman of the Site Selection Committee. The Scouts in Allegany County and the entire Council are indeed fortunate to have this new facility to offer expanded opportunities in outdoor program and Camping which have not been available before in the area. As a Council, we are grateful to the Committee for the time spent in locating the Camp site and for the people in Allegany County for their support", Mrs.

Eighth Annual Trout Derby At Naples

As in the past, Naples will provide a traditional welcome to all fishermen. The Maxfield Hose Fire Co., will have its hospitality booths set up at several areas along the creek bank to supply free coffee to the anglers.
