Rev. Ernest W. Kuebler To Speak At Alfred Sunday, March 31

Unitarian - Universalists and other interested persons are invited to hear Rev. Ernest W. Kuebler speak on "Why Is Liberal Religion Taking Over Today?" this Sunday evening March 31, at 8 p.m. at Howell Hall on the Alfred University Campus. It is hoped that out of this Sunday's meeting, which is sponsored by several Unitarians, will come an interest in forming a Unitarian-Universalist Fellowship & Church School to serve the needs of religious liberals in the Southern Tier area.

A Fellowship is a formally organized, lay-led congregation of 10 or more adults with full status equal to that of a church within the Unitarian-Universalist Association, and meets regularly for religious, social and educational purposes. Membership has nothing to do with acceptance of any set theological doctrine or creed. Unitarians, whatever their religious or philosophical convictions, recognize that the greatest strength of their denomination is their common commitment to ethical ends and a breadth of mind that enables them to hold their widely differing convictions in a spirit of mutual understanding, respect and growth in the search for truth.

Dr. Kuebler is the Executive Secretary of the St. Lawrence District of the Unitarian-Universalist Association, serving 64 Churches and Fellowships in New York State and in the Province of Ontario

and the Montreal area of Canada. He holds degrees from Yale University Divinity and Graduate Schools, Boston University and the Starr King School of the Ministry, Berkeley, California and has had a wide background in administrative and educational work. For 26 years he was an executive officer and director of the Division of Education of the American Unitarian Association and the Council of Liberal Churches. As General Editor of the Beacon Books in Religious Education, he developed materials for children, youth and adults used widely in religious and secular groups and schools in the United States, Canada & Europe.
