A major new plant expansion program costing about one and a quarter million dollars will soon be under way at the Turbine Division of Worthington Corporation in Wellsville. Arthur F. Reinking, president has announced. The new construction will add more than 26,000 square feet of floor space to the existing plant, bringing total plant area to over a quarter million square feet.

President Leland Miles announced that Dr. David Leach, dean of the College of Liberal Arts and chairman of the history department, has resigned his administrative position and has been granted a two-year leave of absence effective July 1, 1968, to complete a book on Walter Lippmann and engage in related research.

Henry Scott, a native of Wellsville and lifelong resident of Allegany County, observed his 99th birthday anniversary at an open house Sunday in the first United Methodist Church of Scio. Hosting the celebration were his stepdaughter, Mrs. Albert Jennings and members of the WSCS.

More than \$1.4 billion was paid by the State Education Department to local school districts in

the 1966-67 school year to support elementary and secondary education throughout the State. Allegany County schools received a total of \$7,323,937 of which \$7,276,414.40 was in general aid and \$47,523.48 in special aid (text book), for the 1966-1967 year. Andover received \$385,907.05 total; \$381,953.94 general; and \$3,953.11 special.

A debate on the topic of dissent will open the annual Great Issues Conference on April 4 at State University and Technical College in Alfred. Participants in the opening program will be William A. Rusher, publisher of the National Review, a leading journal of conservative opinion and Professor Murray B. Levin, who will analyze student radicalism in the sixties. Lomax one of the leading voices of Negro dissent; Dr. Howard Zinn, a leader in the pacifist movement; and Dr. Harold Taylor, educator and author of more than 300 articles.
