Senior Interview

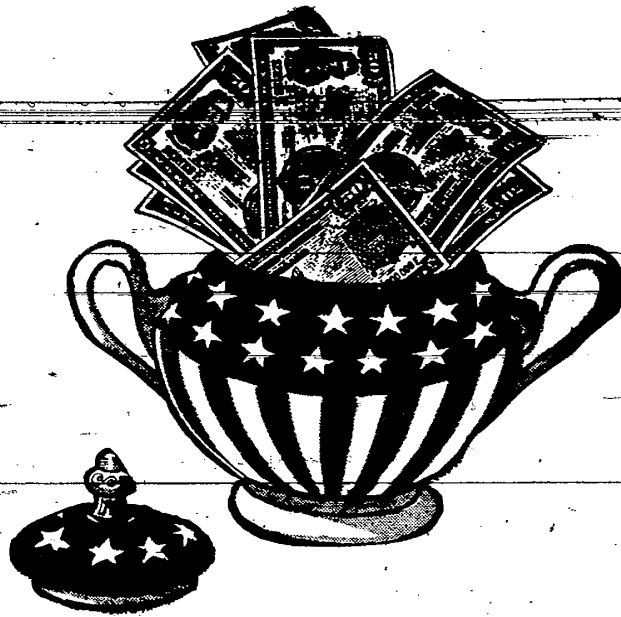
