### Belmont Board Of Education Wins Award

The Belmont Central School Board of Education has been selected a winner in the National Education Association—Thom McAn School Board Awards program for 1968. The board will receive a trophy as an award of Distinctive Merit, according to an announcement received today.

The awards program is based on outstanding contributions made by school boards in their respective educational systems and nominations are made by classroom teachers in their respective districts.

Last year, the Belmont School Board offered to undertake the construction of a physical facility for the teaching of occupation-vocational technical education in

Allegany County.

At the time the offer was made and accepted, the Board of Cooperative Services did not have the authority to purchase property or erect buildings. With the support of the Belmont Central School faculty and community, land was purchased and plans for the building are near completion. This project was assumed in addition to the other responsibilities undertaken by all school boards.

Harry Rice is board president, with members Emmett Johnson, Wallace Francisco, Peter Presutti and Allen McDonnell. Francis Evans is clerk of the Board. James F. Feldbauer is supervising principal.

The three top school boards recognized under the awards program for 1968 were those of Fort Worth Texas, in Harvey, J.L. and Rossford, Ohio.

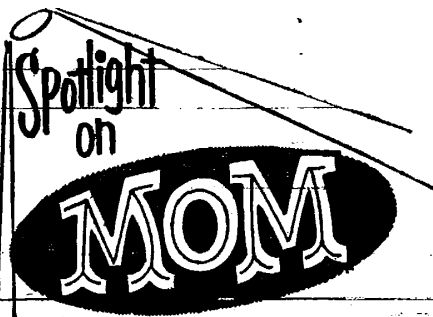
