(MCB6) While in Viet Nam MCB6: killed forty-six Viet Cong; drove their equipment over a million miles; at 10,000 gallons of ice cream, 40 tons of meat, and 190,000 eggs; built, added to or improved 26 miles of road, housing for a battalion of Army troops, 2 hospitals, an electric power station, three oil storage tanks, a USO, an engine repair shop, a library for the USMC, some bridges, and numerous other projects. erous other projects.
