## Ground Breaking Ceremony For Inter-Faith Center Saturday, May 11

Ground will be broken for the first Inter-Faith Center in the State University system at 3:30 p. m. Saturday, May 11, at the Franklin Street site, Geneseo, New York. The event has been scheduled for Alumni Day at the State University College to include the

many alumni donors to the center's fund drive. Newly elected chairman of the center's board, Richard T. Haviland, will head the program.

At the Red Jacket Dining Hall where the alumni luncheon will precede the ground-breaking ceremony, a display area will include Architect Edgar Tafel's drawing of the building, floor plans now in the hands of prospective contractors, a scale model recently completed by Ronkonkoma student James Pickering, and brochures explaining the structure and purpose of the building.

Another student, Craig Burgess of Lockport, designed the sign marking the future site of the building at the north edge of the college campus.

Participants in the ground breaking program will include in addition to board members, College President Robert W. MacVittie, College Council Chairman Joseph Quirk, Architect Tafel,

Student InterFaith Council Chairman Charles LaRosa, and Alumni Association President James Dietzsche.

Plans underway for the past several years are materializing through the donations of not only the alumni, but faculty, students, and friends of the college. The InterFaith Center program has been organized by a college community group of pastors, lay participants, faculty, and students, the InterFaith Center Board.

The center will provide space for formal and informal gatherings of the various denominations, ecumenical activities, a meditation chapel, discussion rooms, chaplain office space, and a library-lounge.
