Unpowered Crafts Require Life-Saving Devices

"Canoes, rowboats, sailboats and other unpowered craft on New York waters must carry an approved life-saving device for every person on board. This may be the major enforcement problem in the Empire State this season", I. James Flowers, Chief of the Bureau of Navigation Law Enforcement, stressed to 92 law enforcement officers attending the annual Navigation Law Enforcement Seminar at Syracuse this week.

Until January 1, 1968, non-mechanically propelled craft in New York were exempt from such regulations, but concern over the increasing rate of drownings from this type of craft caused the Legislature to act to protect the boating public. Of all boating fatalities in the State for the past three years, for example, the rate for non-mechanically propelled craft rose from 27% in 1965 to 38% in 1967.

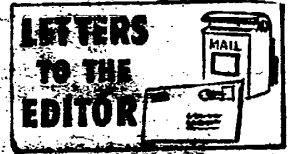
Most of these deaths, accident reports revealed, occurred when people fell from the boat or the boat capsized. A life preserver, life jacket or even a buoyant cushion could have saved these lives had they been available.

The officers attending the three-day meeting at Syracuse took home with them, for the benefit of others on the local forces, the latest information and techniques on all phases of navigation law enforcement, from newly adopted laws and regulations to the technique of accident investigation.
