**Charles E. Goodell Candidate For Re-election**

Representative Charles E. Goodell has officially announced his candidacy for re-election to the U.S. House of Representatives following the filing of petitions on his behalf with the Secretary of State in Albany. The Congressman is the Republican nominee for re-election.

He represents the 38th Congressional District which includes Allegany, Schuyler, Steuben, Cattaraugus & Chautauqua Counties. His home is at 504 Fairmount Ave. W. E., Jamestown.

He was first elected to the House of Representatives in 1959 and will have completed nine years in the House this month. He successfully ran for re-election in 1960, 1962, 1964 and 1966.

Representative Goodell is Chairman of the House Committee on Planning and Research, is a member of the formal leadership of the House and serves as a member of the Joint House - Senate Republican Leadership. He is a member of the Republican Coordinating Committee.

Having served on the Committee on Education and Labor since his first election, the Congressman is now the third ranking Republican on that active committee.

Since his election to the House at the age of 33, he has proposed a number of legislative programs designed to return fiscal integrity to the government while offering effective assistance in meeting the needs of the Nation.

These proposals include: The Manpower Development and Training Act, signed into law by President Kennedy in 1962, was written by Representative Goodell.

The Equal Pay For Women Act was so amended by the Congressman that the original law is considered to have been written by him.

The Opportunity Crusade, a massive proposal reaching into many branches of government, would redirect the War on Poverty, reduce the Federal spending by cutting waste and duplication but provide more help to the poor by involvement of the private sector of society in the battle.

The Human Renewal Fund of 1969 would reduce the Fiscal year 1969 budget in specific areas by \$6.5 Billion. Of this amount \$2.5 Billion would be fed back into top priority programs to meet pressing national needs. More than 60 other members of the House have followed Representative Goodell's leadership in supporting this program.

The Coalition to Help Malnourished Americans, organized and led by Representative Goodell, is an unprecedented bipartisan plan dedicated to improving Federal programs to bring effective help to hungry Americans.

The first Clean Elections Bill in a generation is pending before Committee now and is a bipartisan bill co-authored by Representative Goodell and designed to clean up the law on reporting of campaign contributions and expenditures.

The Congressman graduated from Williams College, got his law degree at Yale, received his Master's degree in government and served as a special Congressional liaison officer for the Department of Justice.

He is married and the father of five sons.

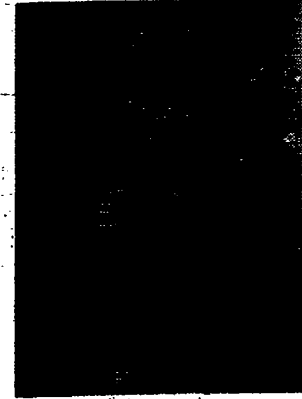

Marine Private John N. Billings, son of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Billings of R.D. 2, Andover, N. Y., completed two weeks of training under simulated combat conditions in the fundamentals of day and night patrolling, employment of infantry weapons, survival methods and assault tactics at Camp Lejeune, N. C.

This individual combat training is given every Marine after his graduation from recruit training. Taught by combat experienced non-commissioned officers of the infantry training regiment at Camp Lejeune, it prepares the young Leatherneck to become part of the Marine air-ground combat team.

While in the field he was taught how to use hand grenades, a compass, and the principles of map reading and land navigation. He learned how to detect and disarm mines and booby traps and, while being exposed to live machine gun fire, he learned to advance safely from one point to another.

From this course, he is scheduled to go on to more advanced training before being assigned to his permanent unit.
