## Class Televised With Student Teacher

A ninth-grade English class at Andover Central School was televised on May 1, 1968 in a project involving the school, Alfred Agricultural and Technical College, and Alfred University.

Mrs. Janice Porter, a senior at Alfred University, was recorded teaching a lesson on American Folklore. The tape, which was viewed immediately by the class, Professor Dirlam, James H. Kessler, Supervising Principal at Andover and Rose M. Baker, sponsor-teacher of Mrs. Porter will be used in a Special Methods English Class at the University. Arrangements for the televising were made through the efforts of Professor H. Alan Dirlam of Alfred Agricultural and Technical College, who is instructor of the Special Methods English Class at Alfred University. The Project Director was George Whitrow, Project Coordinator. Al Nudd, Production Manager, Mark White, and Technical Assistant, Richard Weeks.

It is expected that through the use of this tape, which is similar to a motion picture with the exception that the intended viewer may immediately see the recorded tape, without waiting two weeks for film to be processed, student teachers may be better prepared for what they may actually experience in the classroom. The process is very similar to that of a home tape recorder. However, not only is the sound recorded, but also the picture. The recorded information is then played back through a normal television set such as one has in one's home.
