# Soil Stewardship Week May 19-26, 1968

SOIL STEWARDSHIP WEEK - May 19 - 26, 1968

Soil Stewardship Week, a nationwide observance which places emphasis on man's obligations to God as stewards of the soil, water and other related resources wil be celebrated locally May 19 - 26, according to Wendell Chamberlain, Chairman, Allegany County Soil & Water Conservation District.

This year's observance, with the

This year's observance, with the theme, "A Time for Initiative," underscores the responsibilities of soil stewardship. The Allegany County Soil and Water Conservation District and some 3,000 companion Districts throughout the nation, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, through their State and National Associations, are sponsoring this event for the 14th consecutive year

The Allegany County Soil and Water Conservation District will distribute, upon request to churches of all faiths, booklets created particularly for this year's observation.

The materials were prepared by the National Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts,

in cooperation with a Soil Stewardship Advisory Committee composed of leading churchmen in the nation. The Committee consists of the Rev. E. W. Mueller, Lutheran Council in the U.S.A.; the Rt. Rev. John George Weber, National Catholic Rural Life Conference; the Rev. Harold Huff, Board of Missions, Methodist Church; the Rev. Henry A. McCanna, National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.; and the Rev. Lewis Newman, Southern Baptist Convention.

Through the 1968 theme and in the attractively illustrated booklet, emphasis is placed upon the provocative challenges of proper use as God-given natural resources.
