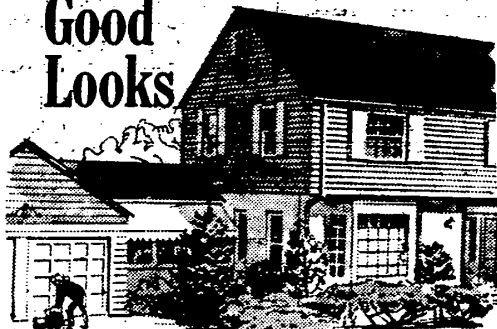
Dr. John Nystrom of Houghton was dinner chairman. Speaker was Warren Byerly, Allegany County probation officer.
