He is an active member of the Knights of Columbus, the Elks Club, the Wellsville Rotary Club, and the Emerald Hook and Ladder Company.



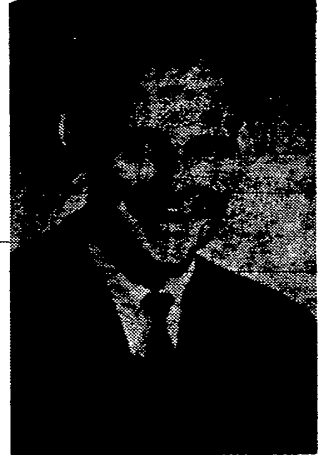

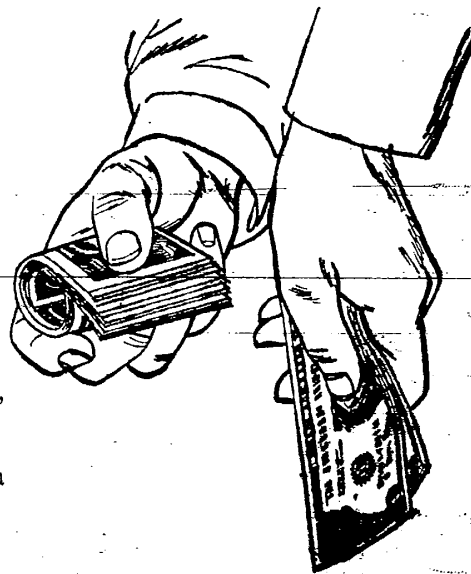

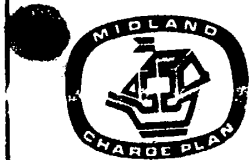
