Work was completed May 1. In the cafeteria all new service equipment was installed, making it possible to serve more people at one time than in the past. The school will maintain three 20-minute lunch period each day. While the number of students will be about the same as last year, around 350, four new teachers have joined staffs of the high school and elementary school. They replace out-going teachers. Bus routes will be extended when students go back to school at noon September 3rd.
