Greenwood Central School News

The monthly school board meeting held at the Greenwood Central School on September 9 was called to order by Richard York, President, with members Stanley Holt, Wallace Holt and Charles Smith present.

Mr. Matthews of the Thomas Bus Body Co. was present and indicated that our new bus was in the process of being completed. He discussed with the Board several proposed changes and improvements that they had in mind for the new bus. The Board decided to sell Bus No. 6 upon receipt and approval of our new bus and it will be advertised for bid this fall.

Several Board members expressed their willingness to attend the School Boards Convention in Syracuse that will be held on October 27 - 29.

A temporary fence has been erected between the property and the adjacent property of Wallace Holt and students are asked to cooperate in using the proper paths and gates in gaining access to the playground.

Mr. Hoagland reported to the Board that all items of equipment and supplies requisitioned by the teachers had been reviewed based on the approval of the 1968-69 school budget and that all necessary supplies and equipment had been ordered.

A discussion on band uniforms, selections, and payment was held and it was decided that they should be ordered sufficiently early to provide for their arrival for spring concert and the various marching events.

The Board reviewed the school budget and the amount of money remaining in all the various accounts.

The Board decided it would again offer evening instruction for adult ladies also swimming for adults and would sponsor a family night swimming program in connection with the Town Recreation Project and that no charge would be made for participants in any of these programs.

The late bus for the purpose of taking athletes and other students, that stay after school, home was discussed and the following schedule was decided upon. Monday night will be reserved for athlete practice and following a long practice the late bus will leave at 5:30. On Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday the late bus will operate for the purpose of taking athletes, swimmers, cheer leaders, scouts, students staying for extra help and anyone else that may have an authorized reason for staying late. Home at 4:45.

Mr. Hoagland reported to the Board that the floor in certain areas of the swimming pool is not satisfactory and that arrangements are being made to have it repaired or replaced under the guarantee.

The Zion League of the Latter Day Saint Church was approved to use the pool and gym on Saturday P.M., on October 19.

Vandalism of the school building was discussed and the Board

and Principal would like to ask the cooperation of all parents in trying to keep their children away from the school building when school is not in session. This request applies only to the school building and not to the athletic field and playground equipment. Students and adults are invited and encouraged to use the outdoor athletic playground and the playground equipment at any reasonable time. The Board requested that the Principal should inform parents relative to violation to this and misbehavior. It was further suggested that the track and athletic equipment be restricted in such a way that it would discourage vehicles from driving on the track and lawn areas.

All claims were approved as presented and the meeting was adjourned.
