Prominent in Masonic circles and was District Deptity Grand Master of the Allegany Masonic District. Surviving are his widow, two sons, three brothers and three sisters. Funeral services were held Saturday in the First United Methodist Church in Wellsville with the Rev. Glenn E. Bucher officiating. Burial was in Woodlawn Cemetery, Wellsville.




