beauty and encourage the development and improvement of its agricultural lands for the production of food and other agricultural products. The legislature, in implementing this policy, shall include adequate provision for the abatement of air and water pollution and of excessive and unnecessary noise, the protection of agricultural lands, wetlands and shorelines, and the development and regulation of water resources. The legislature shall further provide for the acquisition of lands and waters, including improvements thereon and any interest therein, outside the forest preserve counties, and the dedication of properties so acquired or now owned, which because of their natural beauty, wilderness character, or geological, ecological or historical significance, shall be preserved and administered for the use and enjoyment of the people. Properties so dedicated shall constitute the state nature and historical preserve and they shall not be taken or otherwise disposed of except by law enacted by two successive regular sessions of the legislature.

§ 4. A violation of any of the provisions of this article may be restrained at the suit of the people or, with the consent of the supreme court in appellate division, on notice to the attorney-general at the suit of any citizen.

§ 2. Resolved (if the Senate concur). That the foregoing amendments be referred to the first regular legislative session convening after the next succeeding general election of members of the assembly and, in conformity with section one of article nineteen of the constitution, be published for three months previous to the time of such election.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT NUMBER SEVEN CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

Proposing an amendment to and renumbering of section seven of article ten of the constitution, in relation to authorizing the legislature to make the state liable for the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds of a public corporation created to make secured loans to non-profit corporations to finance the construction of new industrial or manufacturing plants in this state or for the acquisition, rehabilitation or improvement of former industrial or manufacturing plants in this state.

Section 1. Resolved (if the Senate concur). That section seven of article ten of the constitution be renumbered and amended to read as follows:

[§ 7.] § 8. Notwithstanding any provision of this or any other article of this constitution, the legislature may be law, which shall take effect without submission to the people, make or authorize making the state liable for the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds of a public corporation to be created pursuant to and for the purposes specified in the last paragraph of section eight of article seven of this constitution, [in a principal amount not to exceed fifty million dollars,] maturing in not to exceed thirty years after their respective dates, and for the principal of and interest on notes of such corporation issued in anticipation of such bonds, which notes and any renewals thereof shall mature within [five] seven years after the respective dates of such notes, provided that the aggregate principal amount of such bonds with respect to which the state shall be so liable shall not at any one time exceed one hundred fifty million dollars, excluding bonds issued to refund outstanding bonds.

§ 2. Resolved (if the Senate concur). That the foregoing amendment be referred to the first regular legislative session convening after the next succeeding general election of members of the assembly, and, in conformity with section one of article nineteen of the constitution, be published for three months previous to the time of such election.

Rev. Hurne Returns To Andover

"Andover is a very picturesque community with its rolling hills and well kept homes dotting its hillsides. It has changed in its physical appearance in the last two decades but its people are still the warmhearted friendly folk I knew twenty years ago." These are some of the comments made by the Reverend Milton C. Hurne, who has recently returned to our community to assume the duties as the new pastor of The Christian and Missionary Alliance Church on Rochambeau Avenue.

Rev. Hurne came to Andover as a young minister in September of 1942. He and his young family were here until December of 1944 at which time he accepted a call to a church in East Rochester, New York. He was ordained in 1946 while in that pastorate. He moved to Penn Yan, N. Y., in 1952 for the purpose of opening a new church in that community. He then served for two and one half years as the pastor of The Christian and Missionary Alliance Church of Geneva, N. Y. For the next five years, he did supply preaching in the area around Rochester while working for the Lincoln Rochester Bank.

He received a call to fill the pulpit of the Bristol Springs Free Church in April 1964 and has filled that place until he moved to Andover September 21.

Rev. Hurne and his wife raised a family of six children, who are all active in their churches where they reside. Mrs. Hurne died about a year ago and now Mr. Hurne lives alone in the former Seventh Day Baptist Church parsonage on East Greenwood Street. He is looking forward to an active ministry here and is working toward the building of a new church. He expects to begin a survey of the entire area within the next two weeks. We wish to welcome Mr. Hurne back to our community and hope that he will meet with every success.
