# PROPOSED AMENDMENT NUMBER SEVEN CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

Proposing an amendment to and renumbering of section seven of article ten of the constitution, in relation to authorizing the in relation to authorizing the legislature to make the state liable for the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds of a public corporation created to make secured leans to non-profit corporations to finance the construction of new industrial or manufacturing plants in this state or for the acquisition, rehabilitation or improvement of former industrial or manufacturing plants in this state. this state

Section 1. Resolved (if the Senate concur). That section seven of article ten of the constitution be renumbered and amended to read as follows:

[\$ 7.] \$ 8.
