New Immunization Law

The 1968 session of the legislature amended the Public Health Law as follows:

Effective January 1, 1969, To require immunization of all children between the ages of two months and six years, and of children entering school, against smallpox and measles, as well as polio (poliomyelitis).

Children receiving measles vaccine must not have a history of family allergies or react to streptomycin, or neomycin. Children who have had gamma globulin or a transfusion of plasma or whole blood must wait six weeks before receiving a measles vaccination.

Your child may be immunized during the next school clinic. If you wish immunization during the clinic, on Tuesday, November 12th please call Mrs. Van Stine at 474-7944 and make an appointment prior to Tuesday, November 6th.

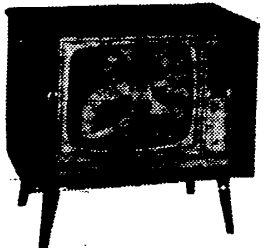
