**Notice To Harborers Or Owners Of Dogs**

**Auto Registration Deadline Extended**

Motorists who have not found the time to renew their car registrations or driver licenses which expire on November 30 get a break from the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Commissioner Vincent L. Tofany said today that they will be given an extra day to visit an issuing office to obtain their renewals. He has extended the normal expiration date of November 30, which falls on Saturday, to the following Monday, December 2.

Through the extension, motorists may continue to drive legally on their present registrations and driver licenses until midnight next Monday but no later.

The Commissioner also pointed out that if car registrations are not renewed on time, owners are required to provide new proof of insurance coverage — the FS-1 form from their agents — when they do renew.

Motor Vehicle offices are closed Saturdays and Sundays.

**Dog Obedience Leader Training Program**
