Reason: For heroism in connection with military operations against an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam: Specialist Four Baker distinguished himself on 11 April 1968, while serving as Team Leader with Company B, 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry, on a combat mission in Dinh Tuong Province. When his company came under a sudden barrage of enemy fire, Specialist Baker directed an accurate base of fire at the enemy positions. Seeing one of his comrades hit by an enemy round some distance away, Specialist Baker braved heavy sniper fire to move his comrade to safety. Specialist Four Baker's heroic actions are in keep-

ing with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, the 9th Infantry Division and United States Army.
