**I. D. Tags Help To Bring Tabby Home Says Humane Group**

"Last year 55 million lost, strayed, & surplus cats were euthanized in America's pounds and shelters. A lost cat wearing a shiny individualized I.D. tag on his collar has a better chance of being returned to his master", claims the Animal Protection Institute of America, a national humane society based in Sacramento, Calif.

The idea behind a special tag, is to provide quick reference for an individual who finds her, as well as for public pounds or shelters. The owner's name, address and telephone number, and the animal's name are imprinted on the tag.

The Animal Protection Institute has arranged with a California manufacturer to produce engraved stainless steel tags for \$1.00 and gold-plated tags for \$1.50 each.
