

Notice Of Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Public Hearing will be held in the County Supervisors' room at the County Courthouse, Belmont, New York, on December 27, 1968 at 1:30 p. m. in connection with a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law Providing for a Permanent Plan of Apportionment for the Allegany County Board of Legislators on a District Basis". The provisions of said Local Law are substantially as follows:

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent The intent of this Local Law is to reapportion the Allegany County Board of Supervisors in accordance with applicable law.

SECTION 2. The County Board of Legislators The name of the Board of Supervisors will be changed to the Board of Legislators. This Board, which will be the elective governing body of the County, will have the same powers and duties provided by law for a Board of Supervisors.

SECTION 3. Election and Term of Office of Legislators County Legislators will be elected at the General Election held in every other odd numbered year, commencing with the General Election in November, 1969. Term of office will be for four years dating from January first of the year next succeeding such legislators' election.

SECTION 4. Districts and Numbers of County Legislators For the purpose of electing the County Legislators, Allegany County will be divided into five districts. Three legislators will be elected at large from each district for a total of fifteen legislators.

The towns in Allegany County in those five districts are as follows:

District 1 — Towns of Center-ville, Hume, Granger, Grov., Rushford, Canadea, Allen, Birdsall, Belfast and Angelica.

District 2 — Towns of New Hudson, Cuba, Friendship, Clarksville and Genesee.

District 3 — Towns of Wirt, Scio, Bolivar, Alma, Willing and Independence.

District 4 — Town of Wellsville

District 5 — Towns of Burns, Almond, West Almond, Amity, Ward, Alfred and Andover.

SECTION 5. Qualifications of Legislators Each Legislator at the time of his election or appointment and throughout his term of office shall be a resident and qualified voter of a town within the district in which he resides. In addition, he must have been a continuous resident of such town within such district for at least one year preceding his election.

Not more than one legislator can be elected or appointed from among the residents of the same town in any district except in District 4.

No legislator can hold any other elective county, town or village office while he serves as legislator.

SECTION 6. Primary Election for Legislators The nomination of candidates to the office of county legislator shall be at the annual primary election held in the year 1969 and at each annual primary election held in the odd numbered year before the expiration of the term of office sought.

SECTION 7. Vacancies The Board of Legislators will fill any vacancy in the office of legislator by a majority vote. The appointee must possess the qualifications set forth in Section 5 above. The appointee will hold office until the commencement of the political year next succeeding the first annual election at which the vacancy can be filled for the remainder of any unexpired term.

SECTION 8. Meetings with Town Supervisors The County Legislators will meet with the Town Supervisor or Town Supervisors in their respective District at least every three months for

the purpose of liaison between County and Town governments as well as for any other purpose that they may deem appropriate. Any decision, recommendation or resolution decided upon at any of these meetings will not be legally binding on the County Board of Legislators or the County of Allegany. In addition, this Section does not confer any legislative or administrative power or duty on the members of such a meeting or meetings.

SECTION 9. Effect of Other Laws or Acts This Local Law will supersede any inconsistent law or act.

SECTION 10. Separability If any part of this Local Law is found by a court to be invalid, only the invalid part will be stricken and not the remainder of the Local Law.

SECTION 11. Approval and Effective Date The provisions of this Local Law will be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the County of Allegany at a referendum to be held on March 4, 1969 provided that prior legal approval of this Local Law has been obtained from the New York State Supreme Court. If this Local Law is approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of said electors voting thereon, it will become effective on the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State.
