4th Quarter Estimated Tax Due

Wednesday, January 15, 1969 is the deadline for the final payment of 1968 estimated Federal income tax, John E. Foley, District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Buffalo, has announced.

Some persons may have to make an amended 1968 estimate by January 15, 1969 if income changed substantially during the last quarter of 1968. Space to amend the estimate is provided on the notice of installment received by tax-payers or on. a Form, 1040-ES (Amended), "Declaration of Estimated Income Tax for Individuals," which can be obtained from any IRS office.

Others may have to file as original 1969 designation on Form 1040-ES by January 18, if they fust met the filling of an original 1969 designation on Form 1040-ES by January 18, if they fust met the filling of an original of amended declaration otherwise due January 15, 1869, is not required if the taxpayer files his 1968 income tax return and ways in fulfithe balance of tax due by January 31, 1969.

Due dates are different for farmers and commercial fishermen. Publication 505, "Tax Withholding and Declaration of Estimated Tax", furnishes additional information on this subject and may be obtained by dropping a post card to your District Director Internal Revenue Service, 34 West Mohawk Street, Buffalo, New York 14202.
